Please read the following updates and help us maintain a safe and healthy community.

Community Center

The community center room will remain closed. You may access and pick up mail and packages.

If you would like to use the room for a social function, you will need to fill out the attached form and email to natalex@comcast.net. The board will review your request and will need to approve all functions. You will be responsible for clean up and disinfection of the room and bathrooms. The room will be inspected by either a property manager or board member following your event.

Pool

The pool will re-open on Wednesday, July 1. We will try to maintain our normal posted hours of operation. We will follow all the regulations as per State of Maryland. If we find that we cannot follow these guidelines, the board will need to close the pool. Let us all police the use of pool and do our part to maintain the precautions needed for our health and safety.

The maximum allowed people in the pool area is 12.

Every one will need to sign in and shower before and after use of pool. Hand sanitizer will be placed outside of pool door and needs to be used before entering.

Masks are required except when in the pool.

Families may congregate together but other parties need to maintain social distance of six feet.

No pool toys will be allowed. Personal attached flotation devices are fine.

Any items left behind will be placed in garbage, i.e. there will be no lost and found.

The local rental agencies are being notified of these regulations as well. If you rent your home, please advise all renters of these policies.

ADDITIONAL COMMUNITY NEWS

Additional speed humps have been placed on Middleton and South Blakeslee Road. Please obey speed limits.

Remember, all **recreational vehicles need to drive at 15 mph** on our roads. Please do not let **children** drive any vehicles without direct supervision of adult. We have received many complaints of young unsupervised children driving vehicles through the community. This is not acceptable.

The holiday is upon us quickly!! FIREWORKS in Maryland are illegal. Please respect your neighbors and do not use them in our community. There have been several national news stories on fireworks and dangers. Please advise your family and guests that we will not tolerate them at any time.
